## THREE POINTS FOR A WIN

England introduced three points for a win in 1981. Prior to that, a win was worth two points.

New Zealand was the third country to adopt the three-point win in its top competition, behind England and Israel, introducing it in the National League in 1983.

Other countries slowly made the same change, but it wasn't widely adopted until it was used in the 1994 World Cup finals. In 1995, FIFA adopted it as the standard in all international tournaments.

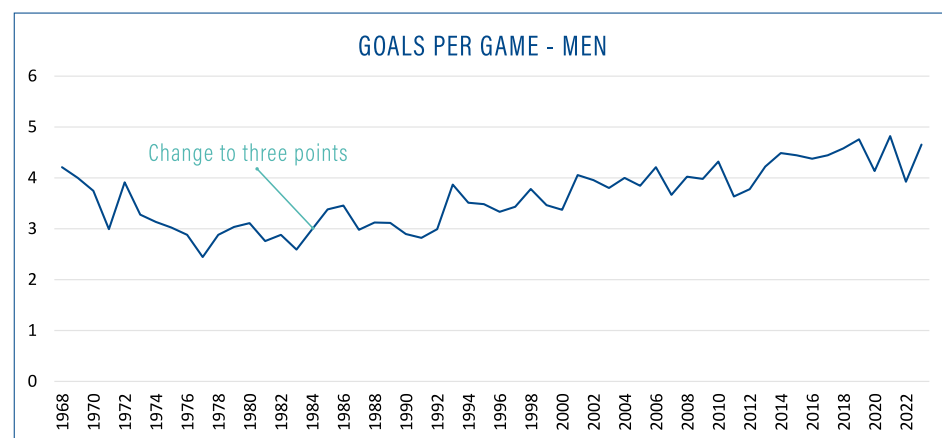
The change was introduced to the men's Central League in 1984. In 1989, the Wellington Soccer Association adopted it for all other competitions.

The intention was to encourage more attacking play. The idea was that teams would be less likely to settle for a draw if they believed the prospect of gaining two additional points (by playing for a late winning goal) outweighed the risk of losing one point by conceding a late goal and ultimately losing the match.

But did it work?

### Men's football

The following graph shows the goal-scoring rate in Wellington's top men's competition for each year since 1968. In most years, that was the Central League, although from 1993 to 1996, it was SuperClub, and from 2000 to 2004, it was Capital Premier.

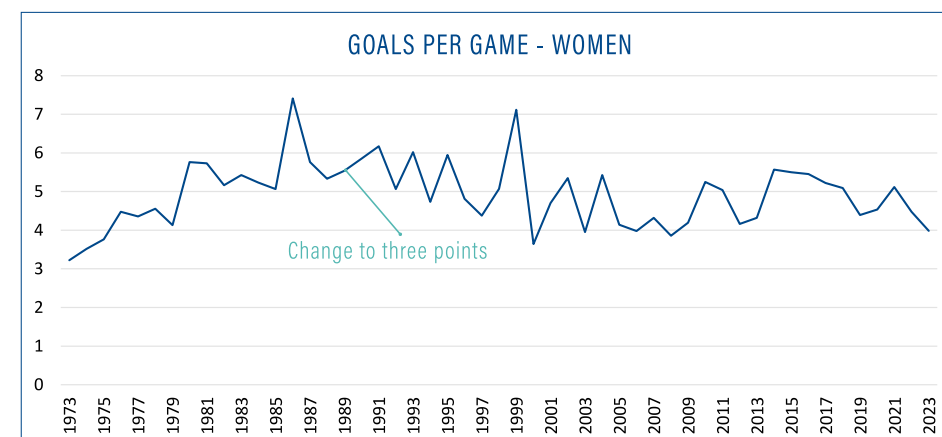


In the first few years of the Central League, there were many goals, but it then began to settle down to about three goals per game. The goal-scoring rate climbed gradually after the three-point win was introduced in 1984. It has averaged about four and a half goals per game in recent years.

While not conclusive, the three-point win has made a difference.

### Women's football

The following graph shows the goal-scoring rate in Wellington's top women's competition for each year since 1973. The top grade varied over time, but since 2005, it has been chiefly Central League or W-League.



For the first few years of women's competition, the goal rate was quite variable, with many one-sided results. After the three-point win was introduced in 1989, the goal-scoring rate continued to vary, and it seems that the three-point win has not made a significant difference. However, it could just be that in recent years, the highest level of competition has become more even.

### Did you know?

If the two-point win had still been in place at the 2010 Men's World Cup, New Zealand would have qualified for the knockout stages ahead of Slovakia.
