

Chairman's Corner

Welcome to game day three for our Des Smith Kemeys Brothers Real Estate Men's First Team, our opponents Western Suburbs, and their travelling supporters. I'd also welcome Palmerston North Marist, who take on our Powerex Women's First Team in their first Women's Central League game on 22 April.

The Men's Firsts come into this match after winning their first two games in the 2023 Central League, a feat last achieved by Petone in 2012. In round two, we played Napier City Rovers at home. McMinn sealed the deal in extra time with a very composed strike to bring



home the 4-2 win. The team shows remarkable resilience and continues to gain confidence. Two rounds in and six points earned – the fans are getting excited.

Our Men's Reserve Team playing Wests at 1:30pm has had a loss and a draw in the first two games of Capital 1, so will be looking for some essential points this week – good luck, lads.

I'm writing this piece on the day of the Women's Firsts Kelly Cup loss against Palmerston North Marist on 1/4/23. This programme will therefore be outdated regarding the balance of their Kelly Cup games.

Our Women's Central League Team will push hard to improve their position from last year. Ryan McGlinchey has been reappointed as head coach, Linda Roeters as assistant coach, and Julia Harrison takes on management and Women's football coordinator responsibilities. We have assembled a strong team with a sprinkling of recruits amongst most of last year's players. This year marks 50 years of Women's football at Petone, so it would be great to celebrate that milestone with glory. Building on a great base over the last two seasons gives me great anticipation for this year's successful and enjoyable campaign.



Multi Title-Winning Coach – Nora Watkins

Nora Watkins coached Petone's Women's First team through much of its most successful period.

Nora was in the first-ever New Zealand women's football team, playing in the inaugural AFC Women's Asian Cup in 1975. She went on to play in all ten of New Zealand's international matches through to 1980, scoring two goals.

She joined Petone in 1994 as coach of the women's first team and had success in her first year in charge, winning the inaugural season of the women's Central League. She repeated that feat in 1995 and 1996. She then

took a year out in 1997, when Kim Nye coached the team, also winning the Central League.

On Nora's return in 1998, Petone again won the Central League. That competition was disbanded after the 1998 season, with Petone having won it in all five seasons. In 1999 Women's 1 had become the highest Wellington division, and Petone won that, again with Nora as coach.

With her at the helm, Petone's women's first team achieved five competition wins in five seasons, with 70 wins, one draw and five losses in 76 league games.

Nora also led Petone to the final of the Women's National Knockout Cup in 1995, 1996 and 1998, and the quarter-final in 1999.

In 1994 she was appointed assistant coach of the New Zealand Women's team in two games against Australia, two against Papua New Guinea and other games against Bulgaria, Ghana and Russia. Then in 1995, she was appointed Coach of the New Zealand team that played two games each against Australia and Papua New Guinea.

What an amazing coaching record!

A Brief History

Formed in 1898, Petone FC is one of the oldest football clubs in New Zealand and is the longest-surviving in our original form – non-amalgamated – in Wellington.

Major on-field achievements have included:

- Chatham Cup winners 1928, 1930 and 1949
- Chatham Cup semifinalists 1994
- Chatham Cup quarterfinalists 1995
- Junior National Cup (New Zealand U18s) winners 1979
- National Youth Championship (New Zealand U19s) winners 2008
- Wellington annual preseason tournament (progressively known as the Hilton-Petone Cup) winners – 1956, 1985, 2000, 2003, 2007, 2010 and 2013
- Central League Premier Division winners 1990
- Capital Federation Premier League winners 2006, 2007 and 2019
- Women's Central League winners 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997 and 1998
- Women's National Ul9s Tournament winners 2021

Petone FC also finished runners-up in the Central League Premier Division in 1992, 1996 and 2008 as well as the Capital Federation Premier League in 2005, 2017 and 2018.

The club organises the annual preseason Hilton-Petone Cup tournamen which, since 1955, has attracted an almost maximum number of entries from clubs in the Wellington region and which is an established part of the local football scene.
