## CHAIR'S CORNER

Welcome to **Round 4** of the season and another big day of football at Petone. It is a full programme today as Petone FC take on Waterside Karori across the grades—looking forward to it.

We start the day with our **Women's 1st Team** at home to Karori, kicking off at **11.00am**. It is great to see women's football leading today's programme yet again. Powerex Petone come into this game with three wins from three, including a historic 2-1 victory over Wellington United last week. Since 2020, this is the second time we have beaten them—an excellent achievement for our women and our coaching team.

Karori sit top of the league on goal difference, with three wins as well, so they will come into this match with plenty of confidence. This is a huge game for both clubs as we clash head-to-head for that all-important 2027 National League spot.

The action continues with a strong afternoon of men's football, with our **Men's Reserve Team** hosting Karori at **1.00pm**, followed by our **Men's 1st Team** also taking on Karori at **3.15pm**.

The Des Smith Ray White Men's 1st Team have started the season with a 0-2 loss against Upper Hutt, a 1-1 draw against Wellington Phoenix, and a convincing 5-0 win over FC Western last week. The team come into this match with real momentum as they face a Karori side still looking for their first win of the 2026 campaign. No doubt Karori will be determined to secure some valuable points. We are certainly looking forward to a hard-fought battle this afternoon.

In the Capital Premier League, our **Men's Reserve Team** started the year with a win, a draw and a loss, while Karori have started with two wins. Anything can happen out there today, with both teams keen to cement a higher place on the table.

Men's Capital 3 starts today for our **Petone Development team**, who play BNU at **5.15pm** as well. That gives us four games on the turf, finishing in the early evening.

## WOMEN'S SOCIAL TEAM

Tomorrow marks the start of the Women's Capital 3 league, with our **Petone Sunshine** competing in their second year. They have a great mix of younger and older women who are absolutely loving football. They won promotion from Capital 4 last year and, with a strong management and coaching team behind them, we are looking forward to more success this season. They also turned up in huge numbers to prizegiving and are running a Movie Night fundraiser on **Monday 4 May**: "The Devil Wears Prada 2", continuing to show great support for Petone FC.

# THE COMMENTATOR'S CALL

---

**DESPITE ENTERING THE SEASON** with the expectation of rebuilding—given that only Luca Siegel, Ollie Pickering, and Nick Drayton returned as regular starters from last year's squad—there was widespread optimism that Petone would open their campaign with a victory.

However, Upper Hutt, much like their performance at Memorial last season, defied expectations and were clearly the superior side, thoroughly earning all three points.

There were bright spots in the match, including impressive debuts from wing players Daler Tochirov and Gabriel Marti, and the energetic midfield return of Ta Eh Doe.

Petone followed up with a stronger showing against Phoenix Reserves at Fraser Park, where Harry Lamont courageously scored his first goal of the season, helping secure the team's initial point.

Last week, Petone truly found their rhythm, delivering a commanding 5–0 triumph over FC Western, newcomers from Taranaki.

The team appeared better balanced, with Hami Paranihi-Nuku excelling as a roaming centre back, Lucas Jelley returning to his junior club as an experienced solid pivot, and Nick Drayton—looking fitter than ever—making dynamic runs up the left side, adding significant attacking threat.

Captain Ollie Pickering led by example with an industrious performance, highlighted by a stunning free kick into the top corner just before the break.

When Harry Lamont majestically netted his second goal of the season early in the second half—thanks to a superb assist from Ta Eh Doe—the outcome seemed inevitable.

The real challenge now lies ahead. With Petone showing their attacking potential, expectations from 'The Balcony' are high for their upcoming clash with Waterside Karori.

Although Karori have endured a difficult start to their season, Petone must seize this opportunity and secure a win on home turf.

Defensively, Petone appears robust, with Jake Powell and Blake Chandler offering tenacity, the midfield showing agility, the wings providing speed and flair, and Harry Lamont, with two goals in two games, brimming with confidence.

While lightning seldom strikes twice, Petone fans are hopeful it will today.

Even with the wins stacking up, there is plenty of room for growth, and I'm confident our Women's team will keep improving as the season unfolds. There's every reason to believe they can put together a fantastic run toward the Central League title. Games against Wellington United, Karori, and the Phoenix Under 18's will be key, and a win against Karori today would send a strong and uplifting message about Petone's quality and ambition. Last week's win was a huge boost to the players, who showed such resilience and character after falling behind—a testament to their fighting spirit.

I'm genuinely looking forward to commentating on another inspiring performance today and to seeing a vibrant crowd here, supporting what could be a truly memorable and successful Women's campaign this year. Let's hope the positivity and momentum continue!

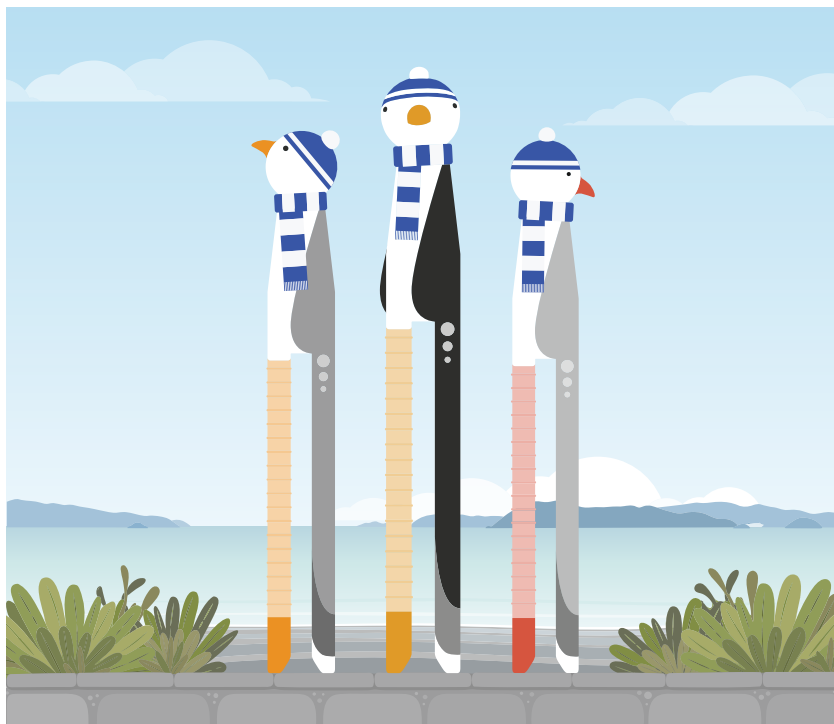

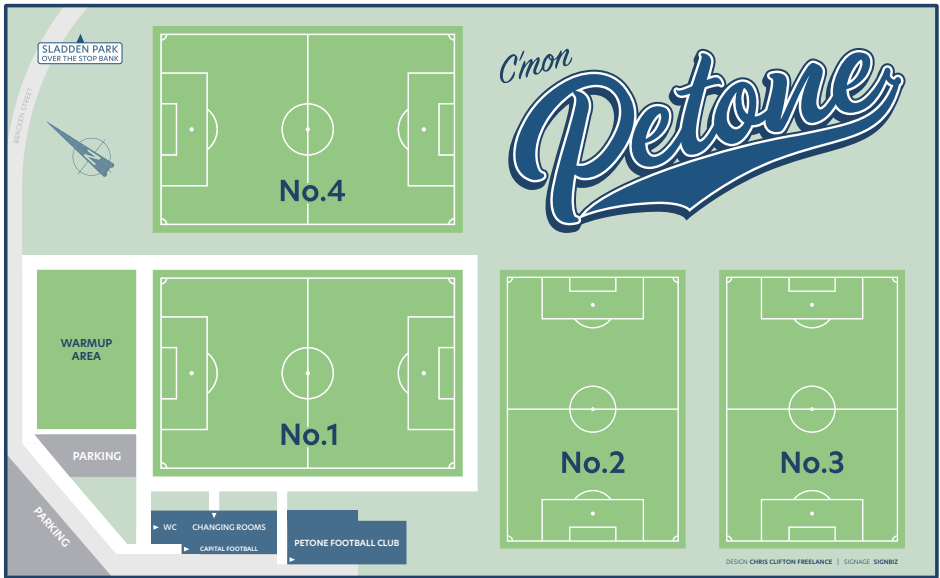

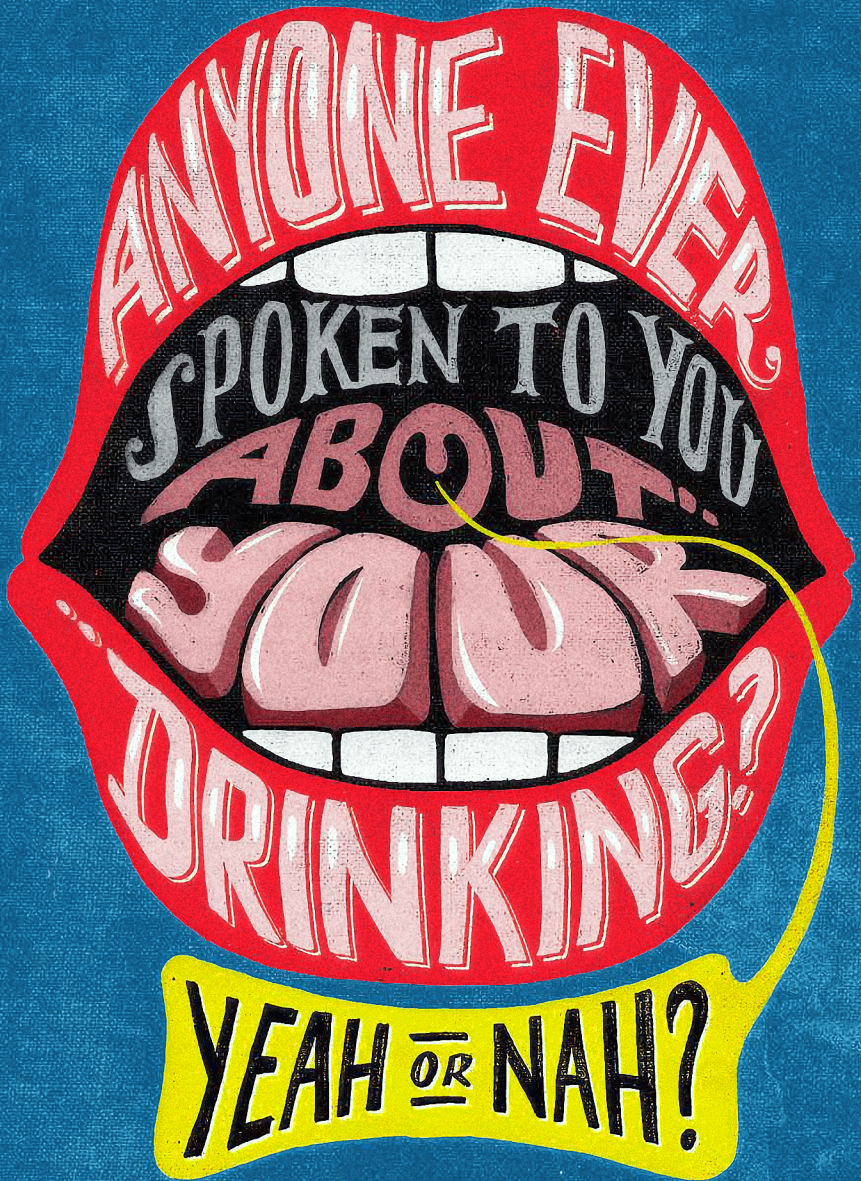
